Because of your support in 2023, Lake County Free Clinic has seen a year of incredible growth! In February, LCFC moved into its new site in Painesville. Since then, LCFC has resumed dental care after a more than three-year program suspension, launched additional evening medical clinics, and expanded care with new volunteers, including two dental hygienists, the Lakeland Community College dental hygiene program, two pharmacists, a diabetes educator, a cardiologist, and an additional orthopedic PA.





Chronic conditions, like diabetes, hypertension and asthma, impact 48% of LCFC patients, and 62% of appointments in 2023 were kept by patients with these three conditions.
